AUTUM TERM BOCCIA TEAM GOES TO REGSIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITION

The Longdean School team of Lewis Brunt, Rachel Hartley, Thomas Hartley and Jessica Stretton represented Hertfordshire and Dacorum in East England Region U19 Schools Boccia Championship having qualified from the Hertfordshire County Competition. The Longdean team

played a series of matches against the champions of Hertfordshire (won 13 - 1), the champions of Essex (won 5 - 4) and the champions of Cambridgeshire (won 7 - 4). By winning all their matches Longdean became East of England Champions and gualified for the National Championship which they attended on 6th March in Sheffield. In the initial group stage Longdean finished 3rd. However that included a comfortable victory against last year's champions, Danum Academy from Yorkshire, and a very narrow defeat on the last ball played by the eventual 4th placed team, West Lea School from London. Defeat in the play-off game meant that Longdean



finished creditable 8th overall in what was a very high level of competition. Well done to the team for such an impressive performance.

YEAR 6 SPORTSHALL ATHLETICS

Sports Hall Athletics events for year 6 pupils across the district were held at three different venues from Wednesday 5th March- Friday 7th. 21 Schools entered the competition creating their own boys and girls teams, pupils where then selected to compete in track and field events throughout the



three events all pupils showed brilliant sportsmanship and competed to the best of their ability. The overall Dacorum winner was Bridgewater, with Kings Langley Primary coming second and St Pauls taking third place. Bridgewater pupils will go on to represent Dacorum at the level 3 Herts Sainsburys School Games Final.

Year 7/8 Sportshall Athletics

On Tuesday 25th February seven secondary schools brought year 7 and 8 boys and girls teams to The Cavendish School to compete in an Athletics event. Pupils where selected by teaching staff to compete in certain track and field events. Field events consisted of long jump, speed bounce, triple jump, javelin throw, vertical jump and chest push.
