Book bags and Rucksacks

A quick reminder about these: Children in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 should bring a school book bag in each day containing their reading books. Children in Key Stage 2 should also bring in a school book bag. However, we recognise that with the increased load of homework books, music books, bigger reading books, snack, etc. some children are finding the book bag too small and are bringing their belongings to school in a rucksack. We have had some issues with the safe storage of larger rucksacks in the KS2 classrooms and members of the Parent Forum are currently investigating the possibility of offering a branded 'Greenway' rucksack. We would urge any parents who are thinking of buying a rucksack for their child for Christmas to hold on until this group reports back. Watch this space!

Lost Property

There continues to be quite a lot of lost property, with many items of clothing not named. Please can you check the lost property regularly as we would like this to be empty by the end of term. Please ensure ALL clothing is named including coats, scarves, hats, gloves and all items of PE kit.

Healthy Snacks

You may be aware that the government provides a free, healthy snack, to be eaten at morning break-time, for all school-children up to Year 2. This consists of a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables, or occasionally a small box of raisins. In recognition of the fact that older children may also be hungry by mid-morning, those in Key Stage 2 (KS2) are allowed to bring in their own 'healthy' snack.

We have noticed recently that increasing numbers of children in KS2 are eating snacks at breaktime that are not very healthy, for example, crisps, pepperami, cereal bars. We teach the children in PSHE and Science lessons about the importance of healthy eating, but feel that the growing discrepancy between the snacks being eaten in FS/KS1 and those in KS2 does not sit well with our message. We recently discussed this at Parent Forum and your class representatives unanimously agreed that a return to healthy snacks was needed.

Consequently, from January 2015, children in KS2 who bring in their own snack may bring in a snack that mirrors that offered in FS/KS1 i.e. fresh fruit or vegetables, or a small quantity of dried fruit. If you have any queries in relation to this, please speak to your Parent Forum representative.

Save the Children - Christmas Jumpers - Friday 12 December

Children are welcome to join them on this day; however we are mindful of the financial support you have already given to the Christmas Fair.
