
Autism Review

Dacorum DSPL is responding to the recommendations made in Dr Glenys Jones's Autism Review. We will be appointing an Autism Lead who will work with schools to make sure that they have inclusive practices and can support children and young people with a diagnosis of ASD. We are working with Hertfordshire County Council to make an Autism Awareness film, showing how mainstream schools can support children and young people with Autistic Spectrum Disorders and how it can improve their experience of school. One of the recommendations in Dr Glenys Jones's report is:

"That whole school work is done on teaching every child about diversity and difference in terms of skills, abilities and preferences which includes information on key developmental and medical conditions such as autism, hearing and visual impairments, physical disabilities and learning disabilities. This should include areas of strength and interests in addition to areas of difficulty. A useful exercise would be for staff to ask all children in a class to develop a profile of themselves

using different formats, as appropriate, and for these to be presented to the class by the pupils over a period of a term." (Recommendation D45)

We would love to hear if you use these resources and how they worked at your school – please let us know. Raising awareness amongst fellow pupils was a suggestion that came up at the Dacorum DSPL Conference last term and we will be running more initiatives in this area.



Hertfordshire SEND Strategy

ADD-Vance Whole School Training

Dacorum DSPL is now funding whole school training! Following the success at Boxmoor Primary School last term, we will now cover the cost of a full or half day training session for all staff at your school. ADD-Vance School Staff Workshops

A one-off ADD-Vance workshop is planned for the latter part of the Spring term for school staff and a further set of twilight workshops are currently being planned for the Summer term. Dates of these will be forwarded in due course.
