## **Matters arising from Parent Forum**

Parent Forum continues to be a very useful two-way communications channel for parents and school. At the most recent meeting several issues arose that we would like to clarify for all parents:

- Top Trumps cards in the playground this is a privilege reserved for children in Year 6. They take out cards that belong to school, not their own. All other year groups are allowed to take a reading book outside at lunchtime but no other games/toys. Please ensure your children do not bring their own games or toys into school (unless asked to do so by their teacher e.g. for a whole class reward)
- Table tennis tables the new table tennis tables are very popular with all classes and there is a rota so that each year group gets a regular turn. At the moment they are out of bounds due to the wetness of the field.

We had a wonderful 'Inter-faith day' in school on 22<sup>nd</sup> November, with a visit from Tom Biggleston from P4C. Tom was delighted to see that the training he delivered to all staff in September has had a big impact on the children's learning and that the values he promotes are already well embedded at Greenway. The children are so engaged by the questions posed in their P4C lessons that we would like to extend the learning into their home lives. From now on, there will be a regular P4C question for them to think about and discuss with you at home. The question for December is:

#### Mud!

A plea to all parents – please ask your children not to go on the field, or the grassy area in the middle of the adventure trail before school. Parents of children in Years 5 and 6 who walk to school unsupervised, please remind your child to stick to the paths when inside the school grounds.
