Sustainability section

At Greenway Primary School we aim to use this money to create a sustainable curriculum for all children. Therefore some of the money provided by the funding will be invested in the professional development of staff and as a result should enhance the quality of teaching for all children. New planning has been developed to create a consistent approach to teaching and assessment of P.E. across the school. As a result, the quality of children's learning and development should be improved.

We have employed a full time sports' specialist teacher to work in our school. He coaches teachers and works alongside them in a range of sports. Due to his influence and expertise, all teachers will have the chance to develop their teaching of P.E. and will team teach with a specialist to increase knowledge, skills and confidence.
