Sports Premium Impact 2014-15

At Greenway Primary School we have split up the funding by the three key areas for consideration; PE Curriculum, School Sport and Health and Fitness.

PE Curriculum

The teaching of PE subject knowledge has grown for staff through the use of professional outside agencies and courses attended organised by the Dacorum School Sports Network. Staff work alongside these agencies and have the opportunity to observe, see effective high quality teaching and team teach with the professionals. Outside agencies have included Apex, Berkhamsted Cricket Club, a Dance specialist and ad hoc clubs, including Raiders Fooball Club as well as supporting lessons in sports such as Lacrosse.

School Sport

The level of school sport has significantly increased over the academic year in terms of participation and competitiveness.

- Through completion of the Annual Sports Premium Audit a total of 273 children took part in out of School hours clubs from a possible 349. That is 78% of Greenway children participate in out of school clubs.
- All children from Year 1-5 took part in intra school competition and all children from Year 1-4 taking part in Inter School competition.
- 36 out of a possible 54 (67%) Year 5 children were involved in inter School competition.
- A total of 12 intra school competitions were held and children were involved in 24 inter school competitions. Within those competitions some were Hertfordshire School Games Competitions.
- 203 children took part in Level 1 competitions, 33 children took part in Level 2 competitions and 4 took part in Level 3 (Level 1 is Intra school, Level 2 against other schools and Level 3 County competition).
