Monitoring and Tracking of Progress

- Through half termly Pupil Progress meetings with the head, deputy , the INCO Mrs Roe and the class teacher's discuss every child
- Targets are set, progress scrutinised and impact discussed
- As a result of these meetings new interventions are put in place, staff can be re-deployed, extra strategies put in place, discussions with parents, children move groups, pupil interviews



Accountability

- Local Authority advisor meets with the Head every term to set targets, challenge and monitor the work we do.
- The Head is accountable to the Governing Body and reports termly on progress made.
