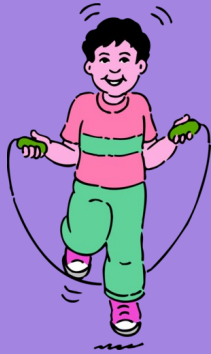
## Network Events Spring 2016

# Dacorum School Games Level 2 Competitions

## Trampolining

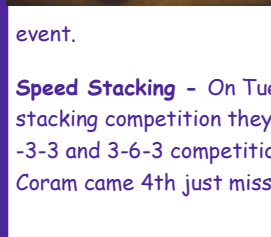

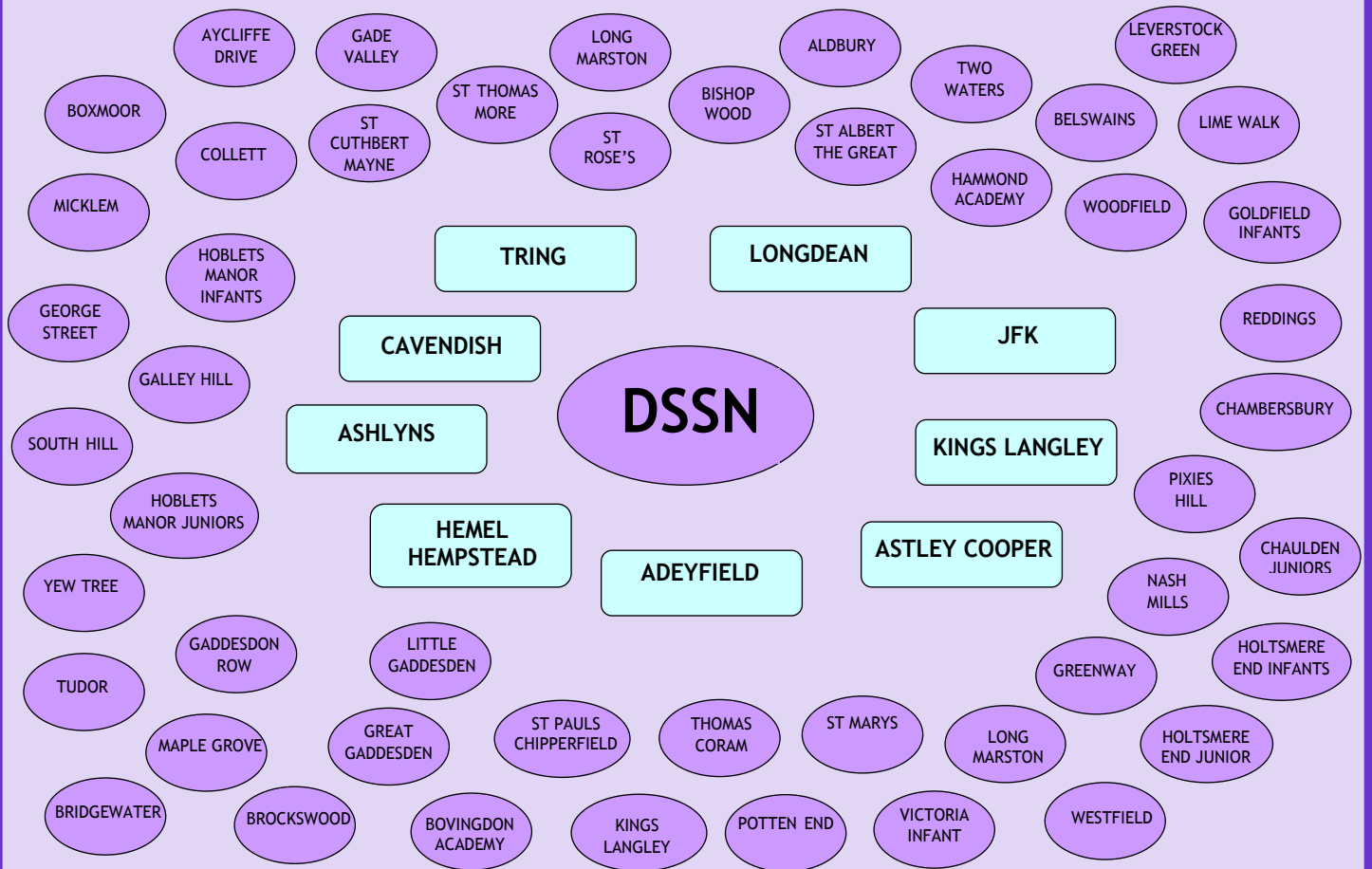

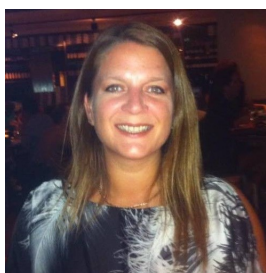
