Practical Matters

Key Information

Children's Mobile Phones

- If your child is going to walk home unaccompanied and you wish them to carry a mobile phone, they may bring it to school.
- The phone must be turned off and handed to the teacher as soon as the child is in school.
- The child's phone must be clearly labelled with their name.
- Please make sure that your child understands that this phone should only be used when necessary; they should not be walking home with them 'on display'.

Communication

Please let us know about:

- Any issues that arise

It is very important that you let us know of anything that may affect your child in school. If you should have any situations that arise that could affect the emotion of your child please also inform us. E.g. moving house, illness of close relatives, parent travelling and being away from home.

Please do not hesitate to make an appointment with your child's class teacher if you need to.

Home Learning

- Spellings the children will continue with the 2 week cycle of learning spellings, putting them into neatly written, imaginative sentences and using the spelling pattern within dictated sentences in class.
- English homework will be given out on Friday to be completed and handed in the following Wednesday.
- Maths homework will be given out on Wednesday to be completed and handed in the following Monday.
- Please encourage your child to complete their homework on time and to take responsibility for it themselves – they will be asked to do it during Golden Time if it is not handed in by the deadline.

English

- Your child will learn English in their class. The learning will be differentiated and children will be able to self select the appropriate challenge – mild, spicy or hot.
- To help your child with English you can practise handwriting, ask your child to write about trips that they have been on, encourage them to read a wide range of texts and also read to your child to help them to develop their vocabulary and comprehension.
- When reading, you could encourage your child to answer questions, find evidence in the texts, consider the word choices used by authors (intent) and summarise a section in their own words.

Reading

- Your child will have a reading record for us to communicate about their reading.
- Your child will be part of a guided reading session once a week and we will communicate how your child has read and offer ideas on their next steps.
 This will be indicated in the reading record GR this sign
- Your child will need to practise reading at home every day. Notes should be made in the reading record so that we can see what children are reading and how often.

Maths

- Your child will learn Maths in their class. The learning will be differentiated and children will be able to self select the appropriate challenge – mild, spicy or hot.
- You can help your child at home by viewing our calculation policy which is on the website.
- There is a list of useful links to internet based maths games and apps on our website.
- Any help with times tables and mental addition/subtraction would be really useful.
- The new curriculum is focussing upon fluency and mastery of maths skills with an increased emphasise on application and reasoning when problem solving.

Marking

- Your child's work will be marked using a green pen and pink and green highlighters. Positive aspects are underlined in pink; areas for growth in green. They will often be given a next step comment, helping them to improve.
- The children will be given the opportunity to read and reflect on their marked work.
- They will be rewarded for excellent work through house points and stars. Special Awards will also be given by Mrs Ellwood and Mrs Crozier in recognition of outstanding effort and achievement.

Philosophy for Children **P4C at Greenway**

The P4C Philosophy for Children approach encourages children to be 'Thinkers'.

Children are given a stimulus such as a story, question or picture book. They discuss, share opinions and develop a greater depth of thinking.
