## Home learning

#### Maths and English

- Literacy homework will be given out on Friday to be completed and handed in the following Wednesday. Occasionally, children may be given a longer period of time to complete project work linked to our themes.
- Maths homework will be given out on Wednesday to be completed and handed in the following Monday.
- If homework is not completed and handed in on time it will be completed during play time, lunch time or Golden Time (this is on advice from past students!).

## **Home Learning**

#### **Spellings**

- •Spellings will be given out every two weeks on Monday. Your child will need to write the words into sentences. Please focus on handwriting, punctuation and demonstration of understanding. They will have two weeks to complete this and they will hand it in on the Friday (but not before, as you are expected to practise them).
- The whole class will learn the same spelling rule, learning the rule and referring to it throughout the two weeks.
- •There will be a dictation exercise every two weeks which will include words using the rule. This is to ensure that spellings are applied in writing rather than just learnt for a test.

# Reading

- Your child will have a reading record for us to communicate with you about their reading.
- These books are to be kept in their school bags so they are available at school every day.
- Your child will be part of a guided reading session once a week and we may offer ideas on what to focus on next.
- The children must record what they have read at home in their reading record at least three times a week.
- Your child will need to practise reading and discussing texts with an adult regularly. Please acknowledge that this has happened by signing the reading record once a week. All reading records will be checked (and signed by the teacher) regularly through the week.

## Maths

- You can help your child at home by viewing our calculation policy which is on our website.
- You can also play games with your child involving Maths board games, card games and games involving different mental strategies are great – as well as mental maths games on the internet.
- You can use money when visiting the shop, weigh items when making cakes and find many practical ways of involving Maths in daily life.
- Times tables and the inverse divisions are essential so please practise frequently.
- Please use Mathletics at home and tasks will occasional be set for homework.

# Marking

- Your child's work will be marked using a green pen and pink and green highlighters. Positive aspects are underlined in pink; areas for growth in green. They will often be given a next step to improve.
- The children will be given the opportunity to read and reflect on their marked work.
- They will be rewarded for excellent work through house points and stars. Special Awards will also be given by Mrs Ellwood in recognition of outstanding effort and achievement. Exceptional achievements will result in a postcard home.
