<u>Foundation Stage Olympics</u> On Monday 25th June and Friday 29th June Primary schools came to-gether to take part in the Foundation Stage Olympics. 

role model and watched a fantastic dance performance! from St Albert the Great RC Primary School. Children were then dispersed to their relevant areas to start their competitions.



Cricket and a second silver in inclusive Tri Golf.


