

## Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2017-2018

Pupil Premium is a grant given to schools to support their disadvantaged pupils and close any attainment gap between them and their peers. It is to be spent on ensuring that pupils that are or who have previously been in receipt of free school meals (FSM), those that are or have been in the care of local authority (CLA) and children of those working in the services make good progress in their learning.

Progress of all pupils is tracked and monitored regularly at half termly pupil progress meetings. The discussions that take place at these meetings and with parents inform our decision about planning appropriate provision.

Summary Information	The main barrier to educational achievement in this group of pupils at our school is; social, emotional, mental health (SEMH), cognition and learning and communication and interaction. These can have a significant impact on learning.
