Safer Internet Day

Greenway marked this national event on Tuesday 5th February with Mrs Crockett delivering an E-Safety assembly all about being 'together for a better internet.' In classes the children had a range of classroom activities based around the theme. All classes have embraced this theme and the children have been exploring this through a range of activities. Richard Maskrey an E-safety advisor, was in school on Monday 11th February. He delivered an assembly for the Early Years and KS1 and class sessions for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. The main focus for these sessions was around does your child know about keeping themselves safe on-line? Are they keeping themselves when they are using Apps and games? Are the apps and games age appropriate? A key link you may want to explore is to google CEOP Play like share. You also might want to discuss with your child about age restrictions on apps and games and think carefully about whether your child has an app that is not age appropriate, such as whatsapp which is only for 16+.

We are delighted to announce that Greenway has been successful in receiving funding for £20 000 to build a Daily Mile track on our field (subject to planning permission). The daily mile track will be a wonderful asset to support all Greenway children and families as well as providing a resource that the community can use. The main focus is to support children's physical and mental well-being and the track will be used by all year groups throughout the year. We shall keep you updated on its progress! A big thank you to our Governors and Mr Lewis in writing the bid.

The GSA have also kindly offered to pay for our new gymnastic wall frame that the children are beginning to use and an upgrade to our laptop trolley which holds 15 laptops. This is used daily and we now need to update the laptops and their software. The GSA, along with school funds is also upgrading some of the apparatus outside and hopefully replacing the surface underneath the apparatus, so that it can be used all year round!
