Our focus was to further up-skill the PE Lead with a Level 6 training in PE Subject Leadership. This training would give the PE lead more confidence with leading the subject and more ideas to implement into daily school life. We have also invested in memberships to the youth sports trust and AfPE. These came with resources for staff and regular updates for the PE lead. The intended impact would be that the quality of PESSPA increases as all staff should benefit from a further developed PESSPA curriculum.
