Below are the phonic sounds we have learnt in school. There are some activities underneath the table to do each day. Some days you might be revising more than one sound. Other days you might choose one sound and do an activity with that sound. In each activity make sure you are sounding out (sound buttons) and blending the words out loud as we would in school.

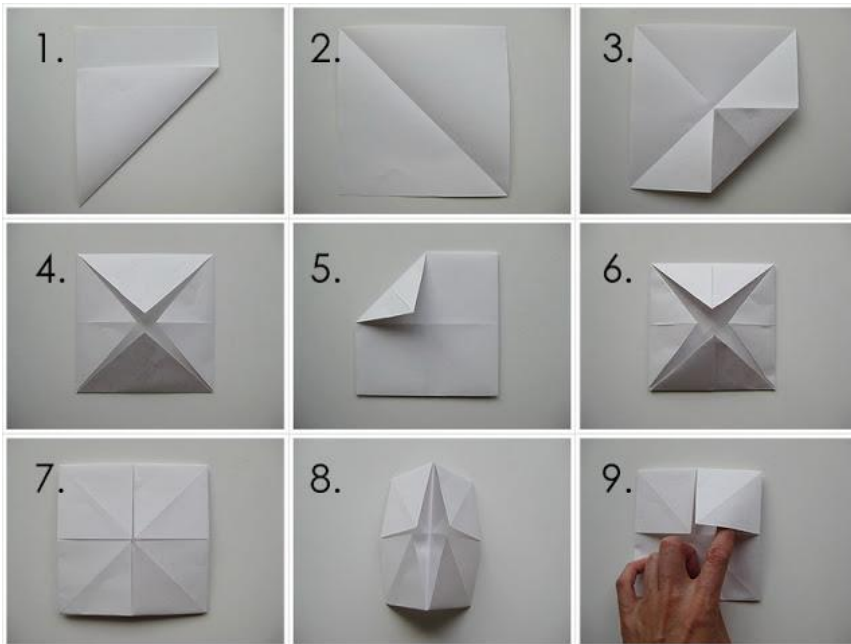

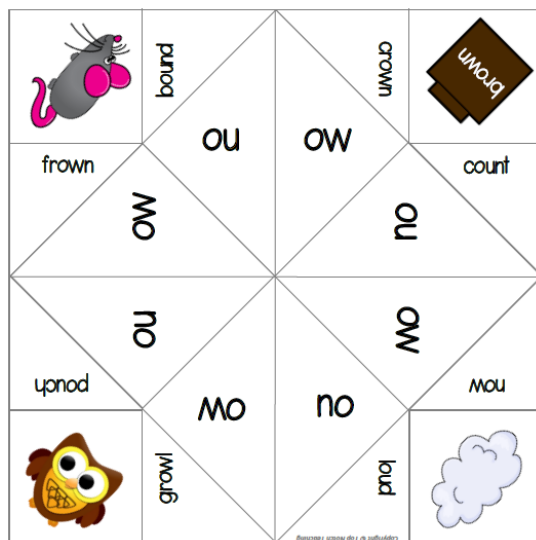
Task 2

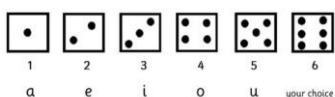
Task 3

Make your own phonics fortune teller! These are the instructions on how to make a fortune teller and then there is an example of how you can fill it with phonic sounds and words. When you see a sound, you could write 5 words with that sound. When you see a word, write that word into a sentence. Challenge: Make one with alien words!

Task 4

Roll my name! (larger version saved in resources) Underneath each number is a vowel a, e, i, o, u and number 6 you get to choose the vowel you use.

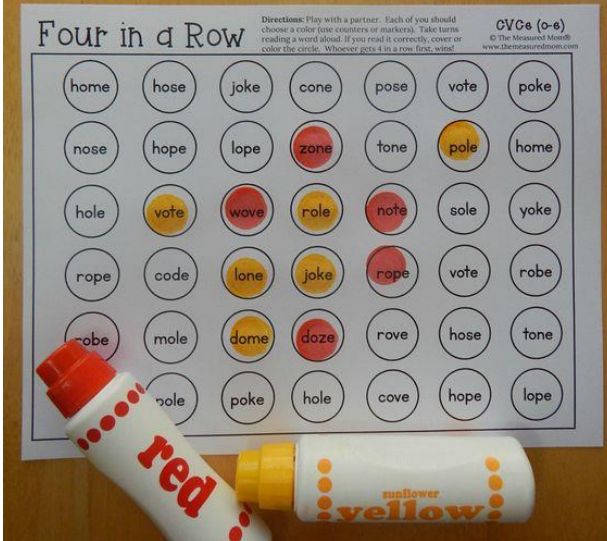
Choose an alien and roll the dice to find out the name!

E.g. h_te and I roll a 2 the name becomes 'hete' now sound it out and blend together.

You can play this numerous times and the aliens may change their names depending on what vowel you roll!

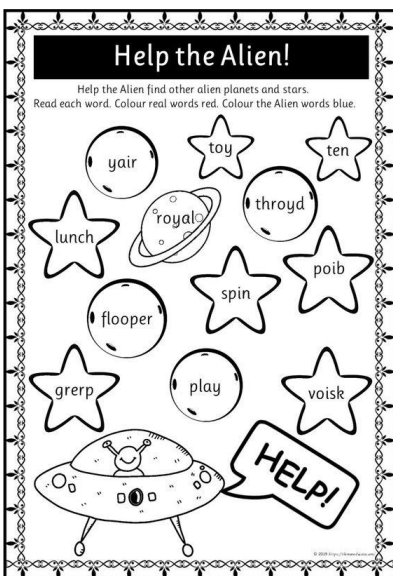


Task 5

Four in a row! Choose a sound and write as many words as you can for that sound. Create a four in a row board and put your words into the circles.

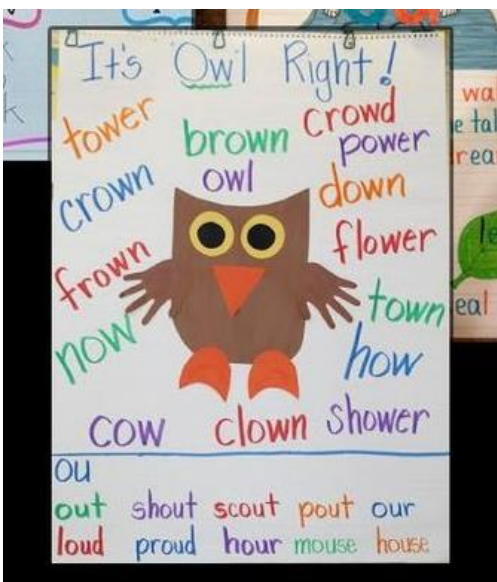
You can now play four in a row with an adult or sibling.

Choose two colours. Sound and blend the word before you colour it in. The object of the game is to try and get four of your colour in a row, but you must stop the other person from getting four too, so you have to block their colour!



Task 6

Help the Alien! (larger copy in resources) The Alien wants to find other alien planets and stars. You must sound and blend the words first. Colour real words red and alien words blue.



Task 7

Choose a sound, for more of a challenge try one you find tricky to remember. Write 10 words for your sound.

Design a poster for your sound using the words you've written - you could draw a picture to go with each word you write.

Make sure it has words and pictures on it not just pictures.



Task 8

Play snap! Choose up to 3 sounds. Write at least 10 words for each sound on separate pieces of paper and make two sets of these word cards.

With an adult or a sibling play a game of snap. As you put the words on the pile you must read them out.

You could play on your own using a timer and see how many words you can read before the time runs out.
