Before you start writing have in front of you:

- Captain Tom's mindmap (attachment)
- Newspaper template (attachment)

Top tips

You might want to include:

- Name of the newspaper
- Headline
- Information in full sentences
- A drawing
- Price of newspaper
- Time openers (First, Next, Then, After that, Then, Finally, On Friday...)
- Conjunctions (and, but, because)

Task

Day 1- Talk for writing

Today I'd like you to practise being a reporter.

The attached mindmap might help structure your thoughts.

1. Write a set of questions that you'd like to ask Captain Tom. Think about what punctuation you need!
2. Practise asking Captain Tom (could be your soft toy or an adult)
3. Write down what your 'Captain Tom' said. (If you used a soft toy, record what you *think* Captain Tom said). You could ask your parents if you could call a family member or friend to be Captain Tom.

Day 2- Mind map

Today you are going to write all the words that you think of about Captain Tom, that you might like to use in your writing. Try and use adventurous word choices and/or words from the books that you read. Make a list of **at least 10** words.

Day 3- Introduction - Time Openers

Today you are going to write the introduction and use time openers. When did this event take place? *Last Friday, Yesterday afternoon...?*

Things to consider in the introduction:

- How old is he?
- What is he famous for?
- What has he achieved?

Check your writing to make sure that it makes sense- time to mumble to yourself to check 😊

Today you are going to write a series of sentences about your interview with Captain Tom using the correct punctuation. Challenge: conjunctions

Yesterday, I was lucky enough to interview the inspiring Captain Tom who kindly spent the time answering my questions.

Day 5- Edit

Read your news report and make any edits that you see.

Complete it if you need more time.

Use the top tips as a check list. Have you included everything?

Today I want you to read your news report, starting at the end, to check for spelling. Is the word you are saying spelt correctly on the page?

Now I want you to read it from the start, this time, I want you to stand up and sit down when you use punctuation. Have you been standing for a long time? Do you need to edit your writing?

Do you want to change any word choices?

Do you want to re-order any sentences?

Do you want to change any sentences?

Read it once more! Check it makes sense!

Now add your drawings, price of the paper and paper name.

You can re-write your draft copy but you don't have too! Share your news report with a family member!
