- Encourage children to continue learning out of school.
- ❖ Keep parents informed about school activities through regular letters home, notices about special events and regularly updating the school website. The school has an expectation that e-mail will be the preferred method of communication.
- ❖ Inform parents as soon as is reasonably possible if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality or any equipment.
- Inform parents as soon as is reasonably possible about any concerns or problems relating to their child's work or behaviour.

The Parents will:

- Support your child in achieving his or her best potential.
- Adhere to school policies and support the school values and ethos.
- Ensure that your child attends school regularly.
- ❖ Ensure your child arrives on time at 9.00am (Nursery) and 8.55am (Reception).
- ❖ Let the school know before 9 am if your child is not attending school that day and provide daily updates if absence continues. If your child attends after school care, also let Waccy leader know via phone call/text that they will not be attending.
- Keep your child at home for at least 48 hours after they have been ill with sickness and/or diarrhoea.
- Follow any Covid-19 quarantine requirements.
- Check your child's hair regularly for head lice and treat as appropriate.
- Avoid sending medication to school apart from inhalers (in exceptional medical circumstances medication will be administered but only by prior arrangement with the Head Teacher).
- Avoid taking your child out of school for holidays.
- Support the school in applying the Behaviour Policy including by offering a positive role model which encourages outstanding behaviour and a positive attitude to learning.
- ❖ Let the school know as soon as possible about any concerns or problems that might affect your child's wellbeing.
- Talk and read with your child at home, to extend their love of learning.

- Pay charges promptly on receipt of invoice
- Avoid driving into the school grounds.
