Plant your Pants this Easter hols!



The Country Trust have launched a free nationwide curriculum linked science project to help discover the health of our soil across the country. It is easy for children and families to get involved in this fun project. The pants can be buried in any soil, even if just a window box!

They need to be left for about 8 weeks and then dug up. The more



They need to be left for about 8 weeks and then dug up. The more disintegrated the healthier the soil. The results can then be uploaded to the Plant your Pants map on the Country Trust website. The scientists will then collate all the data and use it to help understand how we can reverse the damage to our soil.
