Behaviour tips

When school did its last major overhaul of the Pupil Behaviour Policy (https://www. greenway.herts.sch.uk/wp-content/uploads/2023/07/Pupil-Behaviour-Policy-July23. pdf) you asked us to share as much practical information as possible about how staff develop and drive pro-social behaviours and how they manage behaviour issues that do crop up. In response, we pulled together a summary of the most useful strategies that school uses for promoting positive behaviour. Including a host of tips, guidance and even scripts to try out, that document is reviewed annually and published at Annex B of the Pupil Behaviour Policy. We know that these strategies will always work best for your children when they are consistently applied both at home and at school, so we hope you find them useful and will give them a go if you haven't already.

Don't forget the deadline for handing in the money raised is 14th May.


